INFORMATION HELD

This interim catalogue is for the last quarter of 1986 when AIS will concentrate on housing programmes (pages 2-10).

AIS is the only readily available immediate source of information on all details of local authority and Housing Corporation housing investment plans, allocations and associated general and demographic data (within England).

Details of "targetted programmes" will also be available from April 1987 when AIS expects to launch a parallel publishing venture: "TARGET" from locations in Belfast, Dublin, Liverpool and London.

AIS provides regularly updated catalogues listing information contained in the databases. These are available on request to local authorities, environmental agencies, the academic community/educational establishments and to voluntary agencies interested in priority programmes.

Data can be ordered using this AIS catalogue.

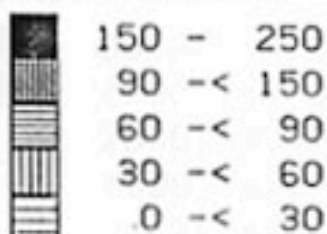

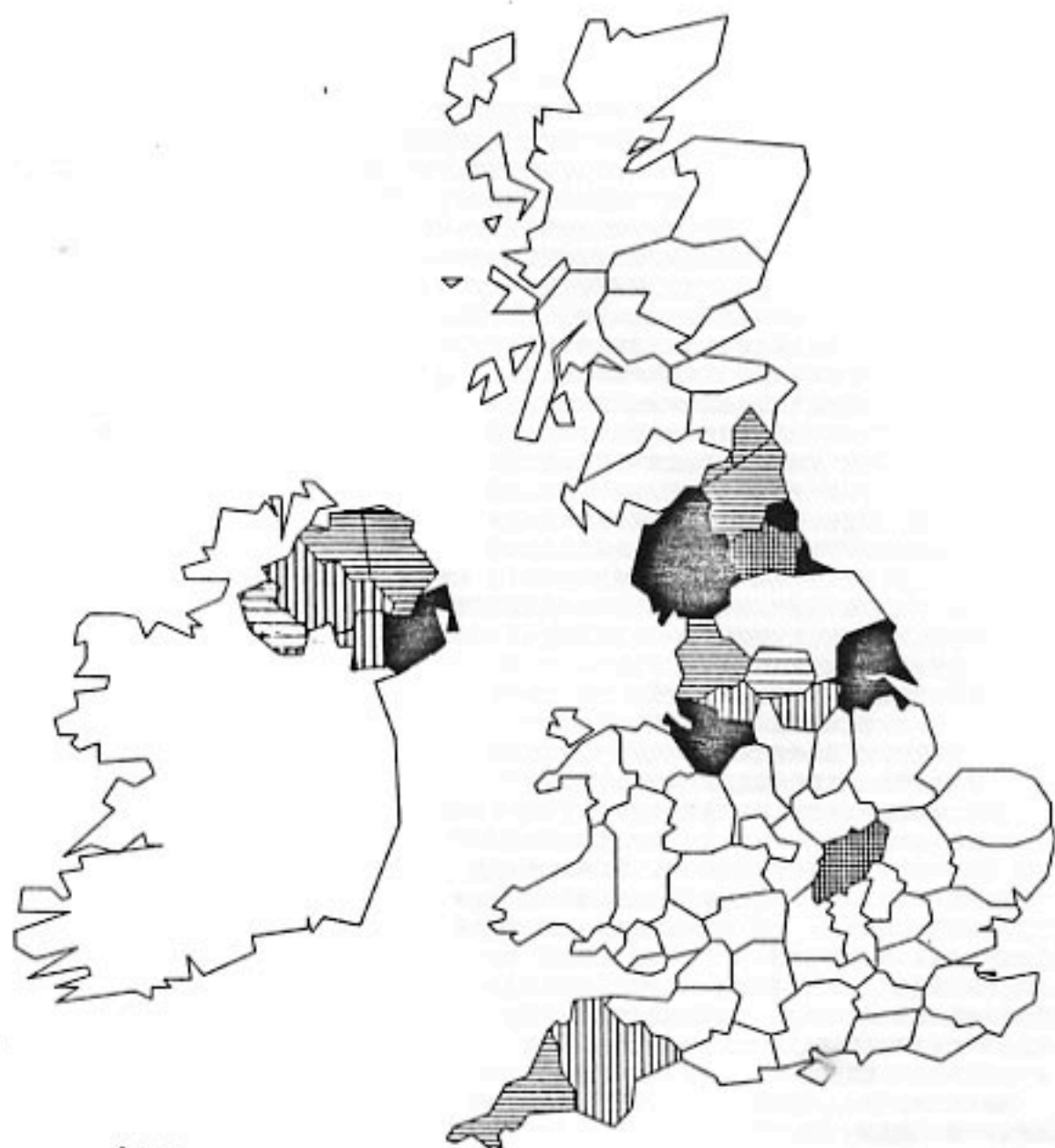
